

Reporting to Parents on Student Progress and Achievement

The school reports to parents regularly on the progress of their child. Reporting methods include:

- **"Meet the Family"**
At the beginning of the year, whānau/teacher meetings are held to begin developing a sound relationship between home and school. Parents/caregivers are asked to tell the teacher information that will help them to best cater for the needs of the children.
- **Formal parent interviews**
These are held towards the end of term 2 and provide an opportunity for the children to explain their learning journey and for all parties to discuss the child's progress and any issues/next steps.
- **Written reporting**
Written reporting of learning is ongoing throughout the school year through the Hero app.
- **Celebrations of learning**
Other events will be held from time to time to provide opportunities for families to share in the success and progress of the children.
- **Informal parent meetings**
Parents are welcome to arrange a time with the class teacher (or vice versa) to discuss their child's progress at school. In most cases, it would be more sensible for these meetings to be held before involving members of the senior leadership team, as teachers will know more about children's progress, achievement, and behaviour.
