SCHOOL SURVEY

One of the questions that we asked parents in the 2017 survey was what they thought about the amount of homework their child is asked to do.

Only 4% (3 people) felt that their child receives too much homework. 39% (29 people) felt that the school does not set enough and 57% (43 people) were of the opinion that their child receives exactly the right amount of homework. The comments too were interesting and varied and the teachers have taken this information on board when setting homework this year. As can be seen by the results, we are never going to please everyone no matter what we do, however, our goal is to encourage families to do some home learning that reinforces what is happening in the classroom.

2019 TERM DATES

New Zealand schools have to be open for the same number of days each year and some flexibility is allowed for start and finish dates. We are very much aware that we are never going to please all the people all the time, but some parents have told us that they would prefer us starting school later in the year (as they are on holiday or out of the country with their children), or that they prefer us to be open for later in the year so that their children are at school longer in the lead up to Christmas. We are aware too that there are other points of view on this. We usually go for the 'early start/early finish' option but to be fair to the other group, next year we decided to mix it up and go for the 'later start/later finish' option.

We like to give parents as much notice as possible for our term dates so that they can arrange their holidays at a time when the school is not open for instruction, so as to maximise learning time. The Board of Trustees have decided to have the following dates for next year.




