

TREATS AT SCHOOL

We have a school rule that states that no lollies, chocolate, fizzy drinks or nuts can be brought to school by the children. There are a range of reasons for this including the effect these products have on children and that they become the object of theft or envy. Other reasons are they are sometimes shared by children when they are brought and their ingredients can impact upon children with allergies or go against personal, cultural or religious preferences such as vegetarianism and halal.

For these reasons, we have made the following decisions:

- Staff members will not be giving out lollies to children at school
- We ask that parents do not bring items to school when their children have a birthday or other occasions. Whilst teachers will always recognise these occasions, parties and food can happen at home.
- Parents taking children on trips are asked not to purchase any food items for children after the events Thank you for your support in these matters.
